The Future use of State-owned Land located within the Mamu People Native Title Claimant Application

The Department of Environment and Resource Management is undertaking a planning study for State-owned land situated within the Native Title Claimant Application QC01/15 by the Mamu People (Federal Court No QUD6014/01). As part of the planning study, the department is seeking feedback from land holders that adjoin the State land, leasehold land and Reserves included in the planning study.

Description of land: 220 lots of Unallocated State Land (USL), 6 parcels of Leasehold Land and 11 Reserves located in the area from Millaa Millaa to Flying Fish Point and south to Kurrimine Beach.

Purpose: To determine the most appropriate use for the sites as per Section 16 of the *Land Act 1994*.

Possible Uses: Examples of possible uses include urban and rural, residential, industrial, commercial, recreation, conservation, infrastructure (e.g. road works, power, water etc.), agriculture/grazing, flood control and scenic amenity.
